Existing Route Map (ERM) / Integrated Network Map (INM)

The Council continues to promote and publicise the approved ERM and INM maps on the Council's website, which includes an Interactive Map facility.

Internal Liaison – ongoing liaison with colleagues from Planning, Highways and Education departments to encourage promotion of and provision for active travel as part of new developments.

Road Safety Team – the Road Safety Team undertook a number of activities to promote Active Travel including:

Annual Quiz: Road Safety hosts an annual quiz for Year 6 pupils, which is offered to all primary schools in Neath Port Talbot: 30 Schools, 150 pupils. [Note: school figures are based on the academic year September 2018 - July 2019]. Works completed on the Neath Canal (NCN 47) The actions taken to secure new active travel routes and between the Crown Food site, Neath and Giants related facilities and Grave, Briton Ferry, Work has included improving signage and road markings, tarmacking, vegetation improvements cutback and removal of barriers. Drainage and signage improvements to Fabian Way and Ffordd Amazon. Pre-work feasibility activities were undertaken, on a total of 18 INM routes. Pre-work activities included: Land ownership checks; Commencing negotiation with landowners (where required) including issuing correspondence and meetings: Adopted highways checks (where required); Public Rights of Way network checks; Biodiversity/Ecological surveys; and Design work. Factors such as topography, viability, benefits to the local community and the potential for the new route to meet 'Active Travel Design Standards' were all taken into consideration when determining which routes should be taken to design stage. 11 routes were designed as a result of this work.
